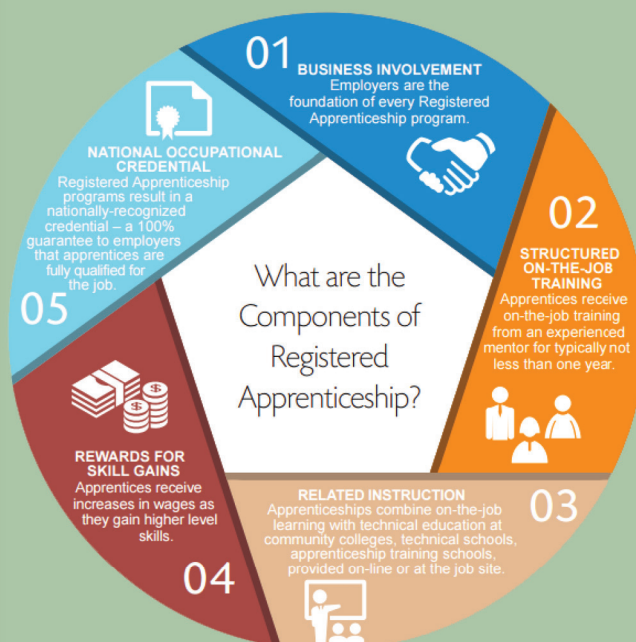
## Responsibilities of an Intermediary Sponsor

The main responsibility of an intermediary sponsor when it comes to a registered apprenticeship is to, in short, make things as easy as possible for both the employer and apprentice.
