



WHAT'S NEW TODAY

Governor Cuomo Press Briefing

• The curve continues to flatten and plateau. Total hospitalizations are increasing slightly, but have remained relatively flat for the last few days. The gross change in new COVID hospitalizations per day is going down, but there were still 1,958 new hospitalizations yesterday.



• There were a total of 671 COVID-19-related deaths yesterday. This represents a decline over previous days – where the number was generally flat. A total of 10,056 New Yorkers have passed away from coronavirus.



• The Governor outlined a "Reopening" Objective process which includes coordinating the reopening of economic, transportation, schools, etc. while watching the infection rate to make sure there is not a second wave. This objective will be designed by public health and economic experts, not politicians, and will have a regional component.





• The Governor is discussing a regional reopening plan with neighboring Governors and the group will make an announcement today at 2:00 p.m. The Governor has previously discussed a desire for a regional plan that includes New Jersey and Connecticut.

• The Governor reiterated that there won't be a definitive moment in time that the crisis will end – there will be no "light-switch." Rather, there will be points of resolution over time where aspects of the crisis improve. The ultimate resolution will occur when there is a vaccine widely available, which could take 12-18 months.

JUST RELEASED: Executive Order 202.16

Through May 12, 2020 the Executive Order issues the following directives:

- The New York City Department of Law shall issue no-action or no-filing letters received during the duration of this executive order within 45 days from submission of such no-action or no-filing application made to the department of law for essential projects involving affordable housing and homeless shelters. For each application granted by the department of law which permits the applicant to solicit public interest or public funds preliminary to the filing of an offering statement or for the issuance of a "no-filing required" letter. The New York City Department of Finance shall process and record condominium declarations for essential projects involving hospitals or health care facilities, affordable housing, and homeless shelters within 30 days of receipt of such filing.
- Any political party, political party authority or political party official, which, by virtue of any law has a caucus scheduled or otherwise required to take place in April or May of 2020, shall be postponed until June 1, 2020, without prejudice, however such caucus may continue if the caucus is able to be held remotely, through use of telephone conference, video conference, and/or other similar service, and provided that notice for any party caucus to be held remotely shall be deemed satisfied if such notice includes specific information on remote participation and has been filed with the clerk and board of elections at least five days preceding the day of the caucus and published either by newspaper publication thereof once within the village, or on the party 's website, or through electronic mail to any previous caucus participant for which the party has an electronic mail address.
- For all essential businesses or entities, any employees who are present in the workplace shall be provided and shall wear face coverings when in direct contact with customers or members of the public. Businesses must provide, at their expense, such face coverings for their employees. This provision may be enforced by local governments or local law enforcement as if it were an order pursuant to section 12 or 12-b of the Public Health Law. This requirement shall be effective Wednesday, April 15 at 8 p.m.

Through May 12, 2020 the Executive Order issues the following suspensions and modifications:

- Sections 8602 and 8603 of the Education Law, and section 58-1.5 of Title 10 of the NYCRR, to the
 extent necessary to permit individuals to perform testing for the detection of SARS-CoV-2, or its
 antibodies, in specimens collected from individuals suspected of suffering from a COVID-19
 infection; individuals performing testing must meet the federal requirements for testing personnel
 appropriate to the assay or device authorized by the FDA or the New York State Department of
 Health.
- Section 711 of the Real Property and Proceedings Law, Section 232-a of the Real Property Law, and subdivisions 8 and 9 of section 4 of the Multiple Dwelling Law, and any other law or regulation are suspended and modified to the extent that such laws would otherwise create a landlord tenant relationship between any individual assisting with the response to COVID-19 or

any individual that has been displaced due to COVID-19, and any individual or entity, including but not limited to any hotel owner, hospital, not-for-profit housing provider, hospital, or any other temporary housing provider who provides temporary housing for a period of thirty days or more solely for purposes of assisting in the response to COVD-19.
