



Governor Cuomo Press Briefing

• The curve continues on a downward trajectory, the number of new COVID hospitalizations yesterday was below 1,000.




• There were a total of 335 COVID-19-related deaths on April 27th. Of these, 306 were hospital deaths, and 29 were in nursing homes. This continues the trend downward, but generally flat. A total of 17,668 New Yorkers have passed away from coronavirus.




• The State will be using two main data points for reopening, based on facts – if a hospital system in an area exceeds 70% capacity or the rate of transmission of the virus hits 1.1, those are danger signs. Reopening will not happen unless you have rates below these factors.



 New York State is unique – we have New York City which is one of the densest areas on the globe, and Upstate which is much different. The percentage of tests that are positive in Upstate is comparable to many states in the Mid-West.



• The Governor reiterated that Un-PAUSE New York will be based upon a regional analysis with everyone working off the same data points and opening template. The Governor emphasized that we have to be smart about this and take into account many factors including if that region has met the CDC 14-day guidelines, healthcare capacity, how to handle isolation (home vs. hotels), not opening "attractive nuisances" that bring in people from outside that region, and ensuring the regional plan fits in with the overall State and multistate plan.



• When discussing business reopening, phase 1 will include construction and manufacturing jobs. These sectors not only employ a lot of people, but also are able to put into place proper precautions. Phase two will involve identifying how businesses can incorporate what we have learned. In order to reopen, businesses must plan on how to institute social distancing and testing while operating. Social distancing, continued testing and ongoing monitoring protocols are a part of our new normal.



- The Governor announced the creation of the New York Forward Reopening Advisory Board
 of 100 business, community and civic leaders who will work with state officials in

- For healthcare capacity, factors such as how many beds/ICU beds are available, and plans for flu season will be taken into account. The healthcare system cannot go over 70% capacity for hospital and ICU beds. With flu season coming in the Fall, hospitalization rates will go up and that must be anticipated by having a PPE reserve in place.



- Testing will be key moving forward. In order for testing to be effective it must be frequent, have the right number of testing sites in accessible locations, and regions must fully advertise testing locations. The State will work off of the Federal government recommendation of 30 tests per 1,000 people per month. The State will prioritize symptomatic people, individuals who have come into contact with symptomatic people, and front line & essential workers.
- Contact tracing must be effectively implemented as well working with Mayor Bloomberg on that. There must be least 30 contact tracers for every 100,000 people, taking into consideration the regional infection rate.
- The Governor reiterated the importance of the creation of a regional "control room" in order to monitor when we start to reopen to watch what is happening, gather the data all (hospital capacity, rate of infection, PPE burn rate and businesses) into one central place, and gauge it every day to determine next steps.
- Regarding public transit workers, the Governor addressed the issue of homeless people on the subway in New York City and that we have to and will do better to make sure the homeless are protected, as are our essential workers.

- \$3.1B in unemployment had been paid out as of Friday April 24th. The State has 3,000 people manning phones to work on claims, but even as they work through the backlog it continues to build. There are approximately 400,000 outstanding claims, most of which are pandemic unemployment insurance something the State has never dealt with before. Per DeRosa, the Executive Order on a 90-day ban on evictions will be extended if it needs to be in order to accommodate this backlog.
- Many of the Summer attractions around the State, such as the State Fair, would fall under "attractive nuisance" and may not be able to take place unless proper precautions are in place or we see a change in virus.
- Decision will be made at the end of this week on both schools and potential summer schools.
- Regarding private colleges and SUNY, cannot tell you what September will look like it is a long way away.
- Guidance will be released later today on elective surgeries for regions that can resume.
